My Introduction to Engineering (MITE) Summer Camp 2012 Application

Part I. Criteria to Apply

The Equal Opportunity in Engineering Program, along with student members of the National Society of Black Engineers, Society of Hispanic Professional Engineers, and Pi Sigma Pi Academic Engineering Society, is pleased to offer MITE 2012. MITE is a FREE, five-day residential program at The University of Texas at Austin that offers current sophomores and juniors with the opportunity to discover engineering through hands-on activities and interactions with engineering students, faculty, staff and alumni.

All applicants must reside in the United States and be current sophomores or juniors in high school during the 2011-2012 academic school year. All applicants must meet at least **ONE** of the following academic criteria below in order for their application to be considered. ACT scores will not be considered.

1. Score a minimum of 500 on the SAT math section
2. Score a minimum of 50 on the PSAT math section
3. Rank in the top 15% of their class
